From the Dean

Of course our Hymn Sing is this Sunday. In my opinion, this is one of the best programs that we do as a chapter. I know that the audience loves having a chance to join in with others in singing the great hymns of the faith. Thanks to the players and singers for bringing this joyful experience to us.

Don't forget our upcoming OAS concert in April. Our featured artists (Duo Corgano) will be presenting a rich program of organ and horn music.
