### From the Dean

Recommended Reading-

No matter how many services and programs one might play, nerves will creep up every once in a while. Lately I have found that if I am performing something with a light registration and manuals only, my brain gets the best of me. I assume it is because there is freed up "thinking power" since I am not using my feet, and the fear of being so exposed. How do we not let that "free space" get filled with doubt and the little devil on our shoulder?

What about when you find yourself making mistakes in performance that went so well during practice time? I thought I would share a nice resource that has helped me overcome the ever sneaky performance anxiety. Written in 1986, Barry Green and W. Timothy Gallwey's book, "The Inner Game of Music", has become one that I regularly open when trying to combat these situations of self-doubt in my playing. Based on Gallwey's earlier books, "The Inner Game of Tennis" and "The Inner Game of Golf", the authors apply the same principles from their sports books, to music.

Describing the "outer game" as the actual activity being done (playing keys at the right time, pulling stops, pressing pedals, etc.) the "inner game" refers to the second game being played in your mind (mental obstacles, lapses of concentration, nervousness, etc.).

Green and Gallwey provide skills and exercises specifically designed for musicians, that can help the reader think about their playing in a different way, and perhaps improve musicality at the same time. I highly recommend this book finds a way on your shelf, or kindle!
